COMPASS - REPORTS

Compass is a centralised location for assessment and reporting information. Students will receive a report four times throughout the year. At the end of Term 1 and 3, students will receive a progress report that indicates their progress in a range of learning habits, as well as the quality of their work. At the conclusion of Term 2 and 4, students will receive a semester report. This will outline their achievement in major assessment tasks throughout the semester and address the learning habits of 'demonstrating effort and readiness to learn', 'meeting classroom expectations', 'persisting with learning', 'processing and producing' and 'seeking and applying feedback'. The semester reports will also indicate the Victorian Curriculum judgement for each subject.

COMPASS – LEARNING TASKS

Teachers use Compass as a platform to share assessment information with students and families through Learning Tasks. Through each of the subject home pages, you will be able to access the task details and due date for each task in that subject. Once the tasks have been assessed, a performance result and written feedback will be made visible and will include any areas for improvement. In some cases, and depending on the task, a Learning Task will have an accompanying rubric and students may need to submit their task through this platform.

If tasks are overdue or not submitted, this will be indicated on the learning task. Teachers will follow this up using Compass chronicles, to notify parents of non-submission or general academic concerns.
