

SPORT & PE UNIFORM



Year 7-12 students attend school in the full Mullauna College uniform at all times. If PE or Sport Education forms any part of the school day, students in Year 7, 8 and 9 can wear their sport uniform all day. Students in the Senior School (Year 10, 11 and 12) must wear full school uniform on all days and are to change into the PE uniform when they have a scheduled practical PE class. Year 9 students may wear their sport uniform when attending scheduled excursions as part of the Skillz program.

For the security of personal belongings, students are required to name all uniform items.

Interschool Sport

Students who are selected to represent the college are required to wear the college sport uniform to all inter-school sporting events. For some sports, an official uniform is provided by the college.

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UNIFORM

College Council has endorsed that complete Mullauna College uniform must be worn at college, to and from college, and on excursions. The uniform is a compulsory part of Mullauna College's identity and is worn with pride by all students. Students wearing items (whether uniform or other) that are deemed in appropriate, an OHS risk, or offensive, will be excluded from classes/programs until the items are removed or replaced. Uniform items should be clean and presentable, appropriately meeting a standard of dress that ensures all students are dressed safely and appropriately for school activities, and preparing students for the expectations of workplaces.

MULLAUNA COLLEGE STUDENT UNIFORM



Shirt: White short or long-sleeved shirt with logo. Long-sleeve shirt is to be worn tucked in.

Dress: College summer dress, length touching the knee

Skirt: College tartan skirt, length touching the knee

Jumper: Year 7-10 college logo blue jumper or VCE college logo black jumper

Jacket: Navy college soft shell jacket

College puffer jacket and puffer vest: optional but recommended for winter

College Year 12 jacket: an optional item for Year 12 students to wear

Shorts: Regulation blue college shorts

Trousers: Regulation blue college trousers

Socks: White or black socks (clearly above ankles, plain and no logo)

Tights: Black tights (no leggings) with skirt.

Shoes: Black leather shoes or completely black runners (no logos or stripes)

Hat: College sports cap (required for Years 7, 8 and 9 PE/Sports classes in Terms 1 and 4)

Tie (optional): Mullauna College regulation tie worn with long-sleeved shirt

Scarf (optional): must be plain navy, black or white

Beanie (optional): Mullauna College beanie, to be taken off when entering classrooms or inside buildings.

Bag (optional): Mullauna College regulation school bag is recommended

Accessories: all accessories such as headbands, hair-ties etc. should be plain navy, black or white only.

UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS

It is expected that students are in full uniform each day. This may require some planning for repairs, cleaning and changing seasons. If there are extraordinary short-term circumstances where a student needs to be out of uniform, a Uniform Pass will be issued by a Year Level Coordinator before school on presentation of a note from a parent/carer.

Sun Smart

Mullauna has a “No Hat, No Play” policy for Terms 1 & 4. Students in Year 7, 8 and 9 are required to wear a hat during Sport Education and Physical Education when participating in outdoor activities. Students can wear a college cap.

Hair:

Hair should be kept tidy and should not be extreme in style or colour. Long hair should be tied back where appropriate for Occupational Health & Safety reasons, especially in Physical Education, Science and all Technology classes.

Make-up:

Make-up should not be visible - this includes false eyelashes and eyelash extensions. Students will be asked to remove make-up and clearly visible nail polish.

Jewellery:

Discrete jewellery like plain rings, small studs or sleepers are permitted. Excessive or perceived dangerous jewellery is not appropriate, particularly: excessive bangles, large bracelets or necklaces, long or large earrings, or similar. Facial piercings like rings or studs in the nose, lip, eyebrow etc. should only be small and discrete. Large piercings present a considerable Occupational Health & Safety risk and must be removed while at school.

Other clothing:

Long sleeved, crew neck white skivvies and t-shirts may be worn under the college winter uniform provided that the sleeves are covered by a shirt or jumper. The wearing of ‘hoodies’, skivvies or coloured t-shirts is not permitted.

Dress code:

This applies when students are permitted to attend activities out of uniform (including casual clothes days). Mullauna College students are required to

- Wear footwear that protects the students from injury. No student is permitted to wear thongs to school.
- Clothing should be appropriate for a school setting. Inappropriate logos, words and pictures must **not** be worn. Singlet and strapless tops are not permitted.

Decisions as to the suitability of any uniform item is made by the relevant Head of Sub School in conjunction with an Assistant Principal.
